FOOD FOR FAMILIES REPORT FORM SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

St. Thomas More Council 7121 runs a Food Drive program every two months at St. Anastasia Catholic Church in Saint Augustine Beach, Florida, from September through May. The May 2020 food drive was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but was supplanted with individual donations and a virtual food drive. Large 1/6 bbl kraft paper grocery bags and/or donation envelopes are handed out by Brother Knights to people leaving Mass on the weekend before the Food Drive. The filled bags are collected the following weekend before each Mass, loaded into trucks, vans, or trailers for delivery to food banks. Monetary donations and gift cards are solicited only as direct donations to the food banks, not to the Knights of Columbus nor to the parish.

The collections at each of the three weekend St. Anastasia Masses are designated to one of the three largest social services organizations in Saint Augustine. The 4 PM Saturday Mass is designated to:

For fraternal year 2019-2020, the four Council 7121 food drives collected **5588 lb of food**, with cash and gift card donations totaling **\$8945**, as shown in ATTACHMENT 1. St Anastasia Catholic Church volunteers have the responsibility for staffing 3-4 days each month at the St Johns Ecumenical Ministries Food Pantry. Each of our 16 volunteers are scheduled to work one or two of those days. They are a wonderful group of people doing God's

In 2019 the pantry distributed 5,554 bags of groceries for 3,711 families which included 3,265 children. That was an increase of **463 bags over 2018**.

Over 38 days at the pantry in 2019, St Anastasia Catholic Church volunteers distributed 883 bags of groceries to 601 families with 530 children.

We purchase most of our food from two agencies; Feeding Northeast Florida and Farm Share. By doing this we're able to purchase goods for less than at retail grocery stores. So monetary donations are always put to the best use possible.

Through your generous donations, both in food and funds, we are able to continue to serve those in need in St Johns County. We expect with the cut backs in government funding for aid programs, and the ever increasing cost of food, the demands on the pantry will continue to grow. As we look forward to the future we are thankful for your continued support



For the first six weeks of the pandemic, food donations still trickled into the parish, approx. 100 lb/week, and when enough accumulated, a load was delivered to **St. Francis House** in St. Augustine or to **Shepherds Haven**, a migrant farm workers ministry in Hastings. The council advanced Sr. Anne Halpin the entire \$400 budgeted donation item for Migrant Workers Ministry (council checks #1101 and #1112, below, delivered as preferred by Sr. Anne in cash by FS Dave Look). Another \$200 in cash and in-kind donations were also forwarded to Shepherd's Haven. Sr. Anne was requested to stop using church facilities on Apr. 28, and all efforts to collect food have stopped. Online efforts continue, but cannot be reported.



The two council checks which were used by the FS to provide Sr. Anne with \$400 in cash which she used to help provide crisis food bank support to Shepherds Haven.


